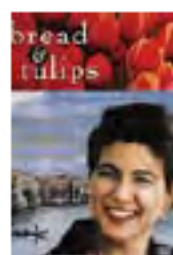
6pm Dinner | 7pm Film Screening - *La Dolce Vita*

*La Dolce Vita* (Italian for "the sweet life" or "the good life") is a 1960 comedy-drama film written and directed by the critically acclaimed director Federico Fellini. The film is a story of a passive journalist's week in Rome, and his search for both happiness and love that will never come. Generally cited as the film that marks the transition between Fellini's earlier neo-realist films and his later art films, it is widely considered one of the great achievements in world cinema.

6pm Film Screening - *Bread & Tulips (Pane e Tulipani)*



An award-winning 2000 romance comedy film directed by Italian director Silvio Soldini, and starring Licia Maglietta and Bruno Ganz. The film was an official selection at many film festivals, including the Cannes Film Festival and the Toronto International Film Festival.

An Italian housewife, Rosalba Barletta (Maglietta), finds herself stranded during a family vacation. Instead of waiting for her controlling businessman husband, she hitchhikes her way home, only to impulsively detour to Venice.

8pm Dinner | 9pm Film Screening - *Cinema Paradiso*



A famous film director returns home to a Sicilian village for the first time after almost 30 years. He reminisces about his childhood at the Cinema Paradiso where Alfredo the projectionist first brought about his love of films. He is also reminded of his lost teenage love, Elena, who he had to leave before he left for Rome. Director: Giuseppe Tornatore. Stars: Philippe Noiret, Enzo Cannavale and Antonella Attili.

4pm Film Screening – *Il Postino* | 6pm Dinner



*Il Postino* (The Postman) is a 1994 Italian film directed by Michael Radford. A young postman's world is brightened as he begins delivering letters to poet Pablo Neruda, exiled on an island off the coast of Italy. At first hoping friendship with the poet will improve his reputation with a local barmaid, he ultimately develops a genuine, touching relationship with the laureate. This was the late Massimo Troisi's final film appearance. Five Academy Award Nominations, including Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actor--Massimo Troisi. Academy Award: Best Original Dramatic Score.
